January Ordinary Council Meeting update

Council received the Council Action Register, confirming the majority of the 205 resolutions made in 2025 have been completed, with the remaining actions continuing to progress well. The latest Council Plan Progress Report was also received, showing that 77 per cent of action items are already underway. Following that, Council endorsed the Bushfire Risk Management Plan 2025–2027, which provides a clear framework to identify and reduce bushfire risk across the Shire.

Next, Council deferred the draft Reconciliation Action Plan until the February Ordinary Council Meeting. This will enable the Shire to consult further on the Plan.

Lastly, Council approved a contract variation for the Harvey War Memorial Library Expansion, which will move the highly anticipated project forward.
