

DOG EXERCISE AREAS

Australind: Reserve 43714 and 31576 known as "Lot 131 Lucy Victoria Avenue, Australind" being a dog exercise area with the area designated north east of the Reserve adjacent to Lowe Court being a "Dog on Leash" area; Lot 42 Leisure Drive, Australind - Leschenault Recreation Park - "Sports Field 3 only".

Binningup: Reserve 39587 Binningup Road, Binningup. "Binningup Oval."

Brunswick: Pt Lts. 7 and 100 Clifton Road, Brunswick. "Brunswick Recreation Ground." Does not include the main Football arena.

Cookernup: Recreation Reserve 17728 located on the corner of Riverdale and Marston Roads, Cookernup. The fenced off area in the south east corner of this Reserve incorporating the Cookernup Community Hall and Bush Fire Brigade is excised from the exercise area.

Harvey: Lot 36 Hinge Road, Harvey. "Meriden Park and the reserve area south, excluding times when organised sports are being undertaken. The area excluding Dr. Peter Topham Memorial Swimming Pool at all times.

Myalup: Lot 100 Reading Road, Myalup.

Leschenault: Eastern portion of Reserve 39950 (Lot 6548) being "Fees Field" located on the corner of Cathedral Avenue and Balmoral Boulevard, Leschenault.

Roelands: That portion of Railway Reserve adjacent to Government Road, north from Colton Road to Waterloo Road.

Yarloop: Lot 412 Teasdale Street, Yarloop. "Yarloop Recreation Ground."

CAT ACT 2011

1st November is Registration Day
THE FOLLOWING LAWS
REGARDING YOUR CAT APPLY.
REGISTRATIONS ARE COMPULSORY

REGISTRATION

All cats above the age of six (6) months are required by the Cat Act 2011 to be registered. The owner of a registered cat must ensure that when the cat is in a public place the cat is wearing its registration tag. Sterilisation and microchipping must be completed prior to registration being approved.

STERILISATION

All cats above the age of six (6) months are required by the Cat Act 2011 to be sterilised. There are some exemptions and cat owners should contact the Shire for further information.

In 2001, The Shire of Harvey introduced the Cat Sterilisation Program for all residents. This valuable assistance has been offered by the four (4) veterinary clinics within the Shire to help with this sterilisation program. Shire residents are able to obtain a maximum of two (2) Cat Sterilisation Vouchers from Shire Offices.

MICROCHIPPING

All cats that have reached the age six (6) months are required to be microchipped, unless the cat is exempt from microchipping (A cat is exempt from microchipping if a certificate is issued by a Veterinarian stating that the implantation of a microchip in the cat may adversely affect the health and welfare of the cat).

DOG ACT 1976

1st November is Registration Day
THE FOLLOWING LAWS
REGARDING YOUR DOG APPLY.
REGISTRATIONS ARE COMPULSORY

All dogs over the age of three (3) months must be registered.

As of the 1st November 2015 an amendment to the Dog Act requires all dogs over the age of three (3) months must be microchipped prior to registration.

PENALTIES

Penalties under the Dog Act 1976 have increased substantially; ie Unregistered Dog \$200.00, Dog Attack, No injury \$200.00, Dog Attack Causing Injury \$400.00. These are the minimum penalties.

DOG ATTACK

Attack by a dog means - aggressively rushing at or harassing; biting or causing other injuries to; tearing clothing or damaging other property of the person attacked; behaving in such a manner, that a reasonable person fears physical injury. For a Dangerous Dog the maximum penalty is \$20,000 and for a dog other than a Dangerous Dog the maximum penalty is \$10,000.

NUISANCE DOG

Anyone who believes that a dog or dogs are creating a nuisance can, by using the prescribed form, complain in writing. If that complaint is substantiated a dog's owner can be served an order (an abatement notice) which has effect for a period of six months. If the nuisance continues the owner breaches the abatement notice and penalties do apply.

WANDERING DOG

Dogs must be on leads in public places unless otherwise stated. Council can seize and impound dogs found in public places and penalties apply.
